- 2. State Road Maintenance Grant (MARRIS)
- 3. Tourism Grant
- 4. Special Grant (only for Sabah, Sarawak, Selangor and Kedah)
- 5. Revenue Growth Grant
- 6. Grants to Local Authorities
- 7. Service Charges to the State (Involvement in Federal Project)
- 8. Concurrent List Grants (including museum and library)
- 9. Compensation for Sabah and Sarawak related to import duty and excise duty
- 10. Financial Assistance to the Local Authorities for the Payment of Electric Bill (Street Lamps and Traffic Lights)
- 11. Economic Development, Infrastructure and Livelihood Grant
- 12. Deficit Grant

Recent Enhancement: Ecological Fiscal Transfer (EFT)

Introduction

- Budget 2019 Allocation of
 RM60 million under
 Pemberian TAHAP
- Budget 2021 -Allocation increased to RM70 million
- Budget 2022 -Allocation of RM70 million

Conditions on use of EFT

- Distribution of allocation takes into account protected areas & sustainability efforts
- Reimbursable to the State Governments
- Expenses made must be in accordance with the criterias set by KeTSA

 Pemberian TAHAP ((Tahap Pembangunan Ekonomi, Infrastruktur dan Kesejahteraan Hidup) (Economic Development, Infrastructure and Livelihood Grant) Initiative taken by the Federal Government to incentivise State Governments to ensure the sustainability of the country's biodiversity


