

An overview of the Bristol One City Plan and Approach

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Bristol, England





- Bristol = 10th largest city in UK.
- One of 11 'Core Cities'
- Estimated population 500,000 (based on pre-COVID figures)
- 22% are Minority Ethnic
- More children aged 0-15 than people aged 65 and over
- 38% of school-age children are Minority Ethnic in 2020.
- 14,600 children under 16 live in low-income families in Bristol, a rate of 17%, just below the national average of 18% (2018/19).
- By 2050, in Bristol, more than 30,000 people will be exposed to significant flood risk.
- First Mayor of Bristol was George Ferguson in 2012,
 Marvin Rees won in 2016 and in May, 2021

WHAT ARE WE TRYING TO SOLVE?

- Hundreds of unaligned city strategies – most of which end in five years or less
- No framework to easily bring together city partners.

- The establishing of a city leadership framework.



One City Timeline



June 2018: City Gathering for 140+ attendees launched first proposals for One City Plan and One City timeline to 2050

December 2018: The inaugural City Partners meeting is held





July: Mayor Marvin Rees brings together 70+ city partners to discuss the City Office concept

January 2017: KPMG begin work with the Mayor and City Office to develop the operating model for the City Office

July 2017: City Gathering with 100+ attendees October 2017: City Hall is opened for City Office drop-in sessions and a number of City Partners are seconded in to work on key products

December 2017: City Gathering 120+ attendees










A new approach to city governance



Coordination of City Office workshops, programme management for specific activities as required




Top 3 priorities for 2021

- Tackle digital exclusion through coordinated citywide action across generations, and respond to the enormous challenges and severe impact of the pandemic on children and young people
- Citywide activity launched to engage citizens on pathways to achieving Bristol's 2030 climate and ecological goals, in lead up to the Conference of the Parties (COP)
- Support community assets (such as community centres / groups) to reduce social isolation and improve mental wellbeing, focusing particularly on communities with mental health inequalities.





